Synthesis of National Implementation Reports and Updates submitted since MoP4 (Sep 2003)

(Prepared by the Secretariat)

The structure of the Synthesis of National Implementation Reports had been revised for the 4th Meeting of Parties in September 2003. It was shortened by handling it as a kind of "index" for the National Implementation Reports. The structure with its Annexes remains similar to previous syntheses; but instead of copying all relevant details from the National Reports, tables including a column called "Inf.Nr., page(s)" are shown to make the details in the relevant National Reports easily accessible.

Annotations:

Roosts: felling hollow trees, rebuilding and renovation of houses, vandalism, covering entrances, filling caves with land or rubbish

Habitats: destruction or deterioration of the vegetation structures important for insect hunting, intensification of agriculture and forestry, destruction of natural landscapes, removal of hedgerows and other linear features, construction of roads and motorways

Disturbance / tourism: use of caves for storage, water supply and others, cave tourism, vandalism, mainly disturbance of hibernating bats, transmitters for mobile telephone networks in direct vicinity of the roost

Pesticides / chemicals: wood preservatives, use of pesticides in agriculture and forestry, timber treatment chemicals

Threats dur. migration: i.e. threats during migration: loss of habitats and interim roosts along the flyways of migratory species, breaking of these routes by large cultivated land and industrial establishment, downfall during migration

Annex A: Status and trends of European Bat Species

According to the Format of National Implementation Reports as revised at MoP3, the summary details of resident species as well as status and trends can always be found in the very beginning of each National Implementation Report (topics B.1. and B.2). A compilation of this data is shown in the table below. If more than one National Report / Update of a Party or NPRS was available for this Synthesis, only the most recent data was taken into account.

Sometimes it is difficult to determine if the classification of the status in the National Implementation Reports was done according to the old or to the new IUCN criteria, or according to different national Red Data Book categories. An exact specification is given only in some of the Reports. But it can be assumed that if the abbreviations "Ex, E, CR, V, LR (= cd, nt, lc), I, DD, K and R" appear, the old IUCN categories were applied, whereas the use of "EX, EW, CR, EN, VU, NT, LC, DD and NE" can be considered as classification according to the new IUCN criteria (2001). To search for more detailed information on the classification, please have a look at the original National Implementation Reports; the relevant document numbers are shown in the table on the front page.
