Brussels, Belgium, 15 – 17 September 2014

Report of the Depositary



The United Kingdom in its capacity as Depositary is pleased to inform the Parties to the Agreement on the Conservation of Populations of European Bats that since the 6th Session of the Meeting of the Parties (Prague, Czech Republic, 20 – 22 September 2010) Montenegro, Cyprus and Switzerland have acceded to the Agreement.

In the same period Montenegro, Cyprus, Switzerland and Portugal have accepted the 2nd Amendment of the Agreement (Bristol, July 2000).

The Depositary wishes to encourage those Parties that have not yet done so, to deposit their instruments of acceptance for the 2nd Amendment of the Agreement.

Up to date status lists for the Agreement (**Annex 1**) as well as for the 2nd Amendment of the Agreement (**Annex 2**) are here attached.

- 2 The instrument of ratification by the Government of the United Kingdom includes The Isle of Man and Gibraltar.
- 3 Ratification by the Government of the United Kingdom was extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey on 23 June 1999.
- 4 Ratification by the Government of the United Kingdom was extended to the Bailiwick of Jersey on 29 October 2001.
- 5 The Competent Authority for the region of Brussels-Capital is the Brussels Institute for Management of the Environment.
- 6 In a letter received by the depositary on 29 August 2003, the Minister of External Relations of the Kingdom of Belgium stated as follows:

"In the relations with other States, the Kingdom of Belgium as a whole is considered to be one single party to the Agreement. Internal concertation procedures, foreseen in Belgian constitutional law and in co-operation agreements between the three regions, will ensure that the three regions will cast one single vote for the Kingdom of Belgium, in accordance with Article V.4 of the Agreement. "
- 7 Estonia declares that the designated authority responsible for the implementation of the Agreement is the Ministry of Environment of the Republic of Estonia.
- 8 In a Note from the Portuguese embassy in London dated 30 March 2011, the Government of Portugal stated that the Convention was extended to include the Portuguese Autonomous Regions of the Azores and Madeira, following the adoption of Resolution 6.3 at the 6th Session of the Conference of Parties to the Convention held in Prague on 20-22 September 2010.
